## Department of Boards and Councils

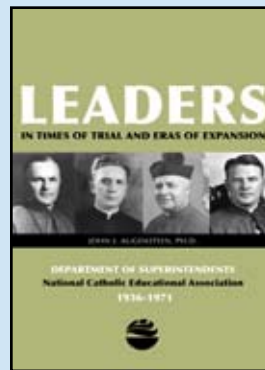

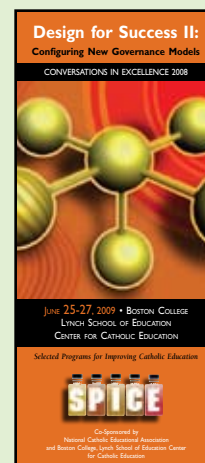

## Department of Elementary Schools

The Elementary Department will offer 125 sessions on a broad range of topics of interest to principals and teachers. On Tuesday Msgr. James Lisante will speak. He is the author of four books, former host of TV's *Christopher Close-Up* and a religion commentator for Fox News. Also on Tuesday, Dr. Beverly Ann Chin will present **Strategies that Improve Elementary Students' Writing and Grammar**. Sr. Angela Shaughnessy's talk: **Emerging Legal Issues for Catholic Educators** will be presented on Wednesday morning following the Keynote address.

On Thursday, the Elementary Department is proud to host Sister Clare Fitzgerald. Her topic, **Facing the Future with Courage and Conviction** will show how Catholic school educators play a key role in shaping the future of our schools and our Church. Dr. Lou Whitaker will return as a Convention speaker to present a session on **Brain-Based Teaching Strategies to Improve Student Achievement**.

Also on Thursday, Loyola University Chicago professors Dr. Lorraine Ozar and Dr. Michael Boyle will present a double session that focuses on the principles of **"universal design"** for instruction as a systematic approach for the prevention of academic and behavioral difficulties. Lorraine and Mike will build upon the material they have contributed over the last year to **NCEA NOTES**. Also on the Elementary program is Dr. Marc Brackett from Yale University, who will share his research on **emotional intelligence**.

This year, the Diocese of Orange is working with the Elementary Department to arrange a number of technology sessions for Elementary administrators and teachers. These sessions will run from Tuesday through Thursday and can be found in Room 304 C of the Convention Center.

## Department of Secondary Schools

New leadership approaches, curriculum models for 21st-century learners, effective advancement strategies, instructional technology, bioethics, and education justice are among the areas on which the Secondary Schools Department will focus at the 2009 NCEA Convention.

The Department offers over 83 breakout sessions that reflect high-priority subject areas as identified by Catholic high school educators. Each timeframe features at least one session on **advancement strategies**, with the session, "Components of a Successful Annual Giving Model" by Mimi Bishop, leading the way on Tuesday afternoon.

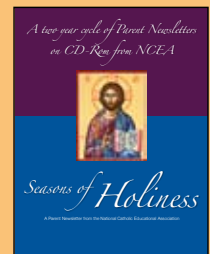
Eight high-quality **instructional technology** sessions are scheduled on topics that include one-to-one laptop programs, learning styles of the Millennial Generation, Gospel reflections on high school technology planning, and a discussion on necessary infrastructure for a tech-savvy classroom facilitated by Dr. Joy Lopez. The Department also welcomes back Mary Ellen Scott from St. Edward High School, which recently completed a state-of-the-art engineering building, to discuss on effective pre-engineering programs.

The Department's program is also rich with sessions that address specific **adolescent development needs** and includes two-time guest on Oprah, Dr. Jill Murray, speaking on "Teenage Abusive Relationships: Causes, Recognition, and Interventions." In addition, six sessions address school and student safety of varying types, and representatives from FDIC's "Money Smart" program will address ensuring financial literacy among students.

The special convention feature, the **Common Ground Meeting Room**, will host less structured sessions that invite participant discussion and interaction on topics that concern educators across the country, such as instructional technology, administrative challenges of service learning programs and research on educational success at Catholic schools.

On Wednesday afternoon at the Secondary Schools Department Convocation, Dr. Anthony Bryk, president of The Carnegie Foundation, author of *Catholic Schools and the Common Good* (1993) and this year's recipient of the Michael J. Guerra Leadership Award, will speak. Departmental Award recipients will be recognized as well.

### Department of Religious Education and NPCD Convocation

Join the Department of Religious Education for catechetical enrichment through 65 religious education workshops for all NCEA members. Topics include Scripture and the life issues, cinema and liturgical music, the power of forgiveness, and time management.

On Wednesday, April 15, the religious education workshops build on Immaculee Ilibagiza's theme of forgiveness and reconciliation.
